

## 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter – Week 1

<b>Day 1</b> <b>Genesis 1</b>  Read pages 9-10, "What on Earth Is God Doing?"  Use the "Creation Week Chart"	<b>Key Thoughts:</b> *The eternal God created "ex nihilo" out of nothing by the power of His Word. *God made man the center of His creation with the purpose of a relationship where man glorifies his Creator. *Man is created in God's image for the purpose of thinking, feeling and making choices to glorify God. *God created two genders, male and female.  <b>Jesus Christ:</b> "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God." (John 1:1) Jesus Christ is the eternal God and Creator and will be the fulfillment of creation's purpose.  <b>Application:</b> Praise God for the answers to how everything began including your own existence.
<b>Day 2</b> <b>Genesis 2</b>  Read "The Dispensations Use The "Dispensations chart" Timeline of Elect & Fallen Angels  Read pages 10-11, "What on Earth Is God Doing?" Satan's Fall	<b>Key Thoughts:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Life is shared by all living creatures but only man has a close intimate connection with God being made in His image and having received breath from God. Only man lives forever</li> <li>• God ordains his plan for marriage for one man and one woman to become one flesh</li> <li>• God set up a day of rest for man</li> <li>• God ordained work for man</li> <li>• Adam and Eve had the ability to choose glorifying God or disobeying before the Fall</li> </ul> <b>Jesus Christ:</b> (1 Cor. 15:45-49) The first man, Adam, sets the stage for the last man, Adam, Jesus Christ. Adam will fall but Jesus Christ, the 2 <sup>nd</sup> Adam, will redeem and restore through his power and wash all who believe.
<b>Day 3</b> <b>Genesis 3</b>  Read pages 11-17, "What on Earth Is God Doing?"	<b>Key Thoughts:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Adam and Eve fall into sin representing all of humanity</li> <li>• Man is alienated from God and can no longer choose righteousness</li> <li>• All of creation is impacted by the Fall</li> <li>• God promises a seed of the woman will defeat Satan pointing to Jesus Christ</li> <li>• Pain, death, and toil enter the world</li> </ul>
<b>Day 4</b> <b>Genesis 4</b>  Read pages 19-20, "What on Earth Is God Doing?"	<b>Key Thoughts:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The first murder takes place when Cain kills Abel</li> <li>• God looks for worship from the heart demonstrated in Abel's sacrifice</li> <li>• God shows forth justice to Cain and his line, while Able and his line are shown the grace and mercy of God believing in the Lord</li> </ul> <b>Jesus Christ:</b> Abel's blood cried out for justice. Jesus' blood declares those who believe in Him and His shed blood will be covered with his righteousness; cleansed from sin and justified before God. (Heb. 12:22-24)
<b>Day 5</b> <b>Genesis 5</b>  Read pages 19-20, "What on Earth Is God Doing?"	<b>Key Thoughts:</b> *The genealogy traces Adam to Noah through Seth's line. The genealogy highlights God's faithfulness and the effects of sin; men died. *Enoch walked with God demonstrating faith and love for God. *The genealogy connects creation with the flood sharing God's plan to preserve a righteous remnant throughout history. *The line spans _____ in the genealogy create a chronological timeline from the creation to the flood.  <b>Jesus Christ:</b> The repeated pattern of life and death speaks of a need for a Redeemer, Jesus Christ (Titus 1:20)
